The Monthly Message



In our Gospel passage this past week (John 12:20-33), one of the first disciples, Philip, was approached by Greek gentiles requesting to meet Jesus. It appears from the text, Philip didn't know what to do, so he decided to ask Andrew, another of Jesus's disciples. (In Philip's defense, he may have been reluctant to introduce foreigners (the Greek Gentiles) to Jesus, because Jesus had indicated that he had been sent solely to

the lost sheep of Israel—see Matthew 15). While Andrew also seemed uncertain about introducing these Greek Gentiles to Jesus, he at least had the wherewithal to say, "lets ask Jesus."

As current day disciples we are either:

- Like Philip, we don't know whether or how to introduce people to Jesus;
- Like Andrew, we don't know either, but we have the foresight to ask Jesus: or
- We are people who take the initiative to boldly introduce others to Christ.

As 21st century disciples with the rich heritage of the church— Scripture, tradition, experience and the ability reason—we have all the tools necessary to introduce people directly to Jesus, without asking the opinion of others. However, we could all use a refresher, a honing of our skills to impact our communities for Christ: skills in the area of building meaningful relationships, listening to understand and connect with people different from us, having genuine, honest, and open conversations with others, and much more.

On **April 20 through the 21**, we will have the opportunity to unleash the power of our ability to relate and connect with others through "...a ground-breaking journey that opens the door to a world of deeper understanding, empathy, and unity through the lens of Relational IQ (an innovative way of connection through the blending of scientific rigor with compassionate understanding)" led by Dr. Cherry Collier, a renowned expert in the field of relational dynamics.

This is an opportunity for our entire church to become effective disciples and expand our reach in building Christ's beloved community. And it is Rev. Dean's and my hope that each of you will take a seat at the table for this priceless opportunity.

I ask in closing, who do you choose to be Philip, Andrew or one who takes initiative?

This Easter- which was earlier this year than most- I am reminded of the amazing trip I was able to take to visit the Holy Lands with Ross Hamilton and members of our church including my sweet husband Andy. If you know me - I have never traveled outside of the country so this was an EXPERIENCE OF A LIFETIME. It was a trip that I have described before as where words could not express how much my journey to the walk where Jesus walked meant to my own personal faith journey. I remember distinctly the almost still Sea of Galilee that I had heard so many stories about in the scriptures. Andy and I walked hand in hand on the path where Jesus began His ministry - through beautiful lush land. The beginning of our trip was quite the contrast to the entrance into Jerusalem with its stone and dry land. The contrast from the beginning of Christ's ministry in the beginning of our trip until its end was the backdrop of Christ's journey. From sharing the love of God for ALL to dying out of that same love for ALL. I think of this pilgrimage that I was so blessed to be

able to make and each year especially at Easter time I have a new perspective of the Easter story. The main thing is that WE ARE EASTER PEOPLE. Because we know that Christ rose from the grave and gives us our place in heaven for all eternity because of it - we are saved. As I was in Jerusalem - the stories of those that spat on Him, mocked Him and denied Him were felt as I would travel His footsteps. Sometimes I think about how so many today do not know the story we know-sometimes I think about how oth-



ers really need to have the knowledge and assurance of a God of grace, for-giveness and love. Seeing the sites I was able to see His journey with those around Jesus not really knowing or understanding the magnitude of His life and death. If they would have been more grace-filled - more understanding and more forgiving - if they could have had a glimpse of the whole story of Christ. It's something I think of often- because I know not only of Good Friday but of Easter morning. It is me and you that Christ forgave on the cross because "they know not what they do". But here's the thing- you and I DO KNOW now and it is our journey to share that news with everyone we come across. It is not for us to pick and choose who gets to know - because Jesus chose ALL He came into contact with. We are called to share the grace, the unconditional love, the forgiveness that WE were given to all who Christ sacrificed His life for. I hope that you have taken the gift of being an Easter people into your own faith journey - because you and me- we can make a difference in this world!
