NEWSFLASH: CHRISTMAS IS NOT YOUR BIRTHDAY

You would never guess this given the bounty that most of us will give and receive throughout the Advent/Christmas season. Last year it is estimated that the average American spent \$886 on Christmas gifts. This does not include the money spent on decorations, food, travel, cards etc. Americans spent slightly more than \$6 billion on Christmas trees alone. Turns out when it comes to "A Charlie Brown Christmas" that so many claim to love, Snoopy is our true hero.

Ten years ago I took the Mission Team leaders from Camden FUMC to a conference at Ginghamsburg UMC in Ohio. Much to my children's chagrin, it was there I first heard "Christmas is not your birthday." Each worshiper at Ginghamsburg is chal-

lenged to match every dollar they spend on Christmas with a dollar donation to the Christmas offering. The result has made a tremendous difference in the lives of people around the world including Darfur and Haiti through wells being dug to provide safe drinking water.

When we returned to Camden I extended that challenge to the congregation. I did the same thing when I was appointed to Concord in Paducah and I do it now here at Bartlett. I realize this is a big ask and for those ready to go all in, great. But if you need some time to absorb this, then this year start out with 10%. For all that you spend on Christmas gifts this year, give 10% to our Christmas offering. Next year hopefully you would give 25%. The following year you will be asked to give 50%. And in 2025 you will be challenged to give 100%. Now I suspect some of you have already started purchasing Christmas presents for this year and I know many will start fairly soon. Keep track of how much you spend and set aside 10%. I think some of you will be surprised by how much you actually spend on Christmas gifts. Then bring your 10%, or whatever the Lord leads you to bring, to the 2022 Bartlett Christmas Offering.

Now let me explain my take on a church's Christmas Offering. It should never go to the budget, the building or something for the church. If our Christmas offering is truly meant to be a gift, then it should go to those in need, not just back to ourselves. This year, your Church Council has adopted two recipients for Bartlett's Christmas offering. One-half of all undesignated gifts will go to Hope House Ministries. Here is their vision statement: "Hope House will be a catalyst for life-long change in the lives of those affected by HIV and poverty." The recipient of the other half of undesignated giving to our



Christmas Offering will be the Shulov family. Most of you are aware of the traumatic year this family has endured. They are our sisters and brothers and they are in need.

In keeping with the Discipline of the UMC, you may designate your gift to one or the other of the two causes and 100% of your gift will go to that cause. However, if you just write a check to Bartlett UMC marked Christmas Offering but with no designation, your gift will be divided equally between Hope House and the Shulovs.

I hope you will accept my challenge to tie your offering to whatever you spend on Christmas because it really is NOT your birthday.

A couple of people have approached me recently about ideas they have had to help make giving to the church a little easier, especially for those who still might not be joining us in-person. The first is our online giving option available on our church website. If you would like to take advantage of this option, follow these easy steps to set up a recurring or one-time gift:

--Go to our church website at www.bartlettumc.org

--Click on the "Give" tab at the top of the home page--Click on "Online Giving" in the orange box. This will redirect you to ServiceU, our online giving platform

--Create an account in order to manage your giving and cut down on the number of time you'll have to enter your information (you cannot set up recurring payments unless you first create an account)

--Don't forget to write down the password you choose for yourself!!

--Complete the online giving form. You have options to give to Operating, Debt Retirement, Capital Improvement, and/or other (designated giving such as Music, Youth, Outreach, Children, etc). When entering the dollar amount, only enter numeric values—you don't have to put a \$.

--Select "Give now" to make a one-time payment or "Schedule Giving" if you want to make recurring payments

--If you selected "Give now" you will be taken to a page where you will select your method of payment—either credit/debit card or ACH transfer from a checking/savings account. Simply enter your account information and click "Submit Gift"

--If you select "Schedule Giving" you will be directed to a page where you will determine when and how many payments you would like to make. You can even select what day of the month you'd like your payments to be made. You'll be asked when you would like your first payment to begin and when you would like the payment schedule to end. Then click "continue" to get a detailed schedule of your upcoming payments. Be sure to follow the screens all the way through until you get the message that your payments have been successfully scheduled.

If any of this process gives you trouble, simply give me a call in the church office and I'll be happy to walk you through it. I've even had members stop by my office and, using my computer, I've helped them set up their payment schedules. Many find this a more convenient way to give to the church than bringing cash or writing a check each week. It really is a matter of preference.

Another simple way to give to the church is through a program called "Amazon Smile." By selecting Bartlett United Methodist Church as your charity to support, Amazon donates .5% of your eligible purchases to BUMC. Especially with the holidays just around the corner, you would be surprised how much that could add up to for the church. If you are interested in supporting the church through this program, go to *www.smile.amazon.com*.
