ALL THE TIME! What an AMAZING group of youth! We are blessed with young disciples who fasted for 30 hours only drinking water, juice and Gatorade and chewing gum with World Vision's 30 Hour Famine! We had a blast getting to know each other better, learning why they are needed to make a difference in the world, learning about life in need in 3rd world countries and see how God has called us to do justice! In the midst of that we made blankets for Appalachia Service Project, put together blessing bags for our congregation to pass out to those in need and filled 10,000+ eggs for My Town Miracles ...oh yea! we slept as snug as a bug in freezing cold and wind in our box city for the night. We cooked lunch for first responders, picked up Rummage treasures, packed over 500 cookies for Service Over Self, challenging games with Timmy, enjoying a wonderful speaker from My Home Miracles. We also broke our fast in the best way to break our fast - COMMUNION - what a blessing to be satisfied from our hunger with the bread ad juice and the understanding that He will fill us when we come to Him first! We soooo would like to thank our congregation, friends and families who responded to our youth's call to Do Justice by donating and supporting them monetarily and in prayer! Finances (Rachel Hasty/rhasty@bartlettumc.org)

I started working part-time for Bartlett UMC in February of 2011. At that time, our SunTrust (now Truist) building loan had a balance right at \$4,000,000. We refinanced that loan in 2013 and then, again, in 2017. The 2017 refinance was going to be the final one with a maturity date of October of 2027. Since that time, we have made 3 extra principal payments totaling \$305,000, shaving off approximately 1.5 years from our maturity date. That means that right now we're looking at finally paying off our building loan in the spring of 2026—2 years away! Our current balance is \$716,000.

Pretty exciting to be so close to paying off this building, isn't it? But we're not there yet. Since our last refinance in 2017, the amount contributed each year to Debt Retirement has decreased steadily from contributions of almost \$350,000 in 2018 to almost \$260,000 in 2023. Our loan payments total \$292,500 each year and we have begun to come up short on a regular basis. Fortunately, before COVID, we had a healthy cash reserve in our Debt Retirement account, enough to cover 5 months of payments should we need it. Today, our reserve will only cover 1.5 months of payments and that cushion is getting smaller and smaller.

For 2024, we received pledges to the Debt Retirement fund of \$207,000. Already for the month of January we received a little over \$5000 in unpledged giving—if that level continues we should receive about \$60,000 in unpledged giving for the year (we only received \$48,000 in 2023). That would still put us over \$25,000 short for the year which means our reserve will be wiped out by the end of this year and we will have to start "borrowing" money from our Operating fund to cover loan payments.

As usual, I've thrown a lot of numbers at you and you might have already quit reading. Here's the short version: we need to see an increase in giving to Debt Retirement. If 105 families could give an additional \$20 a month to Debt Retirement, our shortfall would be covered. If more than 105 families could give or if those families could give more than \$20 a month, then that would just be icing on the cake! I've said it before and I'll say it again, it doesn't take much but it does take all of us! As always, if you have any questions please let me know—I'd love to hear them.
